Each household in the Town of Hamburg is authorized to receive 200 yards of pit run. The price is \$1 per yard if you haul it or \$2 per yard if the town loader is used.

DUST CONTROL

PAYMENT AND REQUEST MUST BE RECEIVED BY APRIL 30, 2018

Our goal is to put dust control on all new surfaces and prioritize our remaining dust control budget on the most heavily utilized roads (3rd, 5th, & 7th between Hwy A & F between Hwy 107 and 9th Lane). Research has shown that applying dust control annually can double the life of a road by keeping the fines on the road. Due to that (and because we know the dust itself is a problem), we've increased our dust control budget and are looking for more ways to apply dust control internally. Dust control will still be available to residents as it has been in the past.

The cost for each 300 foot strip will be \$145.00.

A Note from the Chairman,
Hello Everyone! I wanted to take a few moments to keep you updated on some important events around Hamburg. First off is the MAPS referendum. Indications are that Maple Grove school could possibly close if the referendum doesn't pass, so I encourage you to get

out and vote. But I also want to reassure you that the Maple Grove Governance Board and other dedicated individuals are working diligently on other options to keep Maple Grove open and thriving. Next, is the county-wide addressing initiative. Around the time you receive this, Marathon County should be sending out more information with the timeline and plan. From my discussions, Hamburg will be completed in August or September. The post office will forward mail for a year from your old address, so you have some time to switch your address on everything. Although I haven't received confirmation, Frontier should be beginning their Broadband Internet expansion through part of Hamburg this year. This is something we've pushed for two years now, so my fingers are crossed. We passed several ordinances, one focused on unlicensed and loose dogs, which continues to be one of the largest problems in the Town. If you have a dog, and don't have it licensed, please send in the license. Not only is it the law, and doesn't cost much, but it's much easier to locate the owners if the dog is lost. If you have anything else you'd like to see us focus on, please let us know. Lastly, on behalf of all the Town Board and residents, I want to thank Lee Boehm for nearly 30 years of service and dedication to the Town of Hamburg. We wish you the best of luck in retirement.

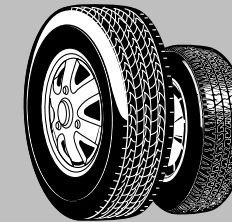

Truck Tires - \$8.00 each
